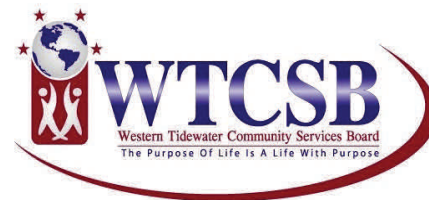

Parents

- Learn how to maintain firm boundaries while showing love.
- Learn new forms of communication to solidify the family unit.
- Learn to promote independence and goal setting with their child.

Children

- Learn to develop and implement short term as well as long term goals.
- Engage in positive activities that will enable the youth to develop a more positive outlook on life and the future.
- Refrain from engaging in negative behavior to increase overall quality of life.

The goal of SAAF is to engage in family interactions to: help adolescents avoid behavior problems, prepare parents for their child's adolescent years, and provide caregivers with tools to help youth set and reach positive goals.

Strong African American Families Program

The Strong African American Families (SAAF) was designed under the leadership of Dr. Gene Brody in partnership with The Center for Family Research (CFR) at the University of Georgia. SAAF is a seven week family-centered program that encourages the use of parenting and resiliency skills. The program targets African American families response to challenges they are face with: everyday parenting, staying connected to youth, peer pressure for substance/alcohol abuse, and early sexual activity. The sessions are designed to work closely with families, schools, and community leaders.
